Official Township Business

The Township recognized July as Parks and Recreation Month and praised our recreation professionals for being vitally important to establishing and maintaining the quality of life in our community. With that being said, starting November 25, 2022 - January 1, 2023 the Mount Olive Recreation Department will host its first annual walk-through Holiday Light Display at Turkey Brook Park. This five week event will be held Thursday - Sunday, 5:30 pm - 10:00 pm. More information will be forthcoming.

The Township completed its first phase of the Cloverhill Development shade tree removal and sidewalk replacement project. Nineteen (19) trees which were causing damage to sidewalks have been removed and corresponding sidewalks have been replaced. If you live in Cloverhill and would like a new shade tree planted, please contact my office for details.

In addition, the Township completed the 2022 road resurfacing project and paved over 8 miles of road way.

The Township also joined a National Opioid Settlement agreement and will be receiving \$324,213 to put toward our efforts in implementing strategies to combat opioids in Mount Olive.

A grant of \$112,500 has been awarded for the purpose of purchasing a new Senior Transportation Bus and \$336,868 has been awarded to continue restoration work at the Seward House. Most notably, for the fourteenth (14) year in a row, the Governing Body authorized the acceptance of the 2021 audit which resulted in no audit recommendations from our auditor.

Leaf pick up will commence and the chipper service will resume the first week of October through the last week of December.

Ordinances & State Laws

The Governing Body amending the Property Maintenance code which expands the Township's power to regulate vacant and abandoned properties and established a limited reimbursement program for Cloverhill residents who have removed shade trees and repaired damaged sidewalks at their own expense. Two State laws took effect which will be implemented by the Township to inspect residential rental units built prior to 1978 for lead based paint. The law requires inspections within two years on certain one- and two-family home rentals and multi dwelling units. In addition, all business owners and owners of multifamily rental units will be required to maintain certain levels of liability insurance and annually register a certificate of insurance with the Township where the business or rental unit is located.

Other Developments

A new turf soccer field has been installed at Turkey Brook Park along with refurbished basketball courts, a new pavilion at the Activity Field and water fountain in the retention basin. In addition, tennis courts at Powerline Park were also refurbished and lined for pickleball. Two open space purchases were finalized at 67 Crease Road and 5 Pondview Drive, a scenic 25 acre property with a pond, boardwalk and a 4,000 square foot building which was home to the historic Tarn Mill. The property will be rehabilitated for passive recreational use and a public meeting space.

Lt. Cordileone was hired by the Mount Olive Police Department in 1997.
